2023 was a year of good news and great impact for the Franklin P. and Arthur W. Perdue Foundation. Our grants touched nearly every community that Perdue calls home. New and important resources in our neighborhoods were named for our founders due to gifts from the Perdue Foundation. Our assets performed in tremendous fashion which will help perpetuate the legacy of generosity that we pride ourselves upon.

We take this moment to reflect on the meaningful grants made in 2023 to better the communities where our associates live and work. While the footprint of the company continues to expand, Perdue Foundation continue to focus on Delivering Hope to Our Neighbors. There were 69 grants awarded, totaling \$1,529,195. Some awards and activities worthy of highlight were:

- Some \$385,000 – 25% of our grants – was awarded to organizations focusing on fighting hunger and poverty throughout the footprint of the company.
- The Franklin P. Perdue and Richard A. Henson Junior Achievement Center opened its doors to educate the youth of the Eastern Shore of Maryland on financial literacy and career education.
- Our desire to assist those seeking the “American dream” remains steadfast and was demonstrated this year with numerous grants to programs focusing on English as a second language and a special grant to The World of Work Program of The Western Kentucky Refugee Mutual Assistance Society, which will provide transportation to those in need while settling here in the US.

I welcome you to review the full impact of the Franklin P. and Arthur W. Perdue Foundation in the enclosed pages. In 2023, as in every year, we strive to emulate the philanthropic spirit of our founders, Arthur and Frank Perdue, and the stewardship of the Foundation’s Board of Directors and Committee Members as well as the Perdue Family. 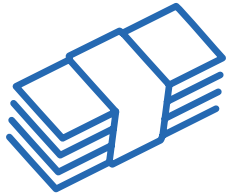

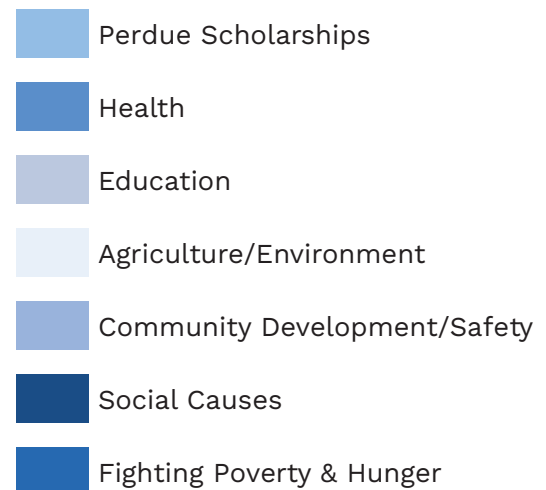
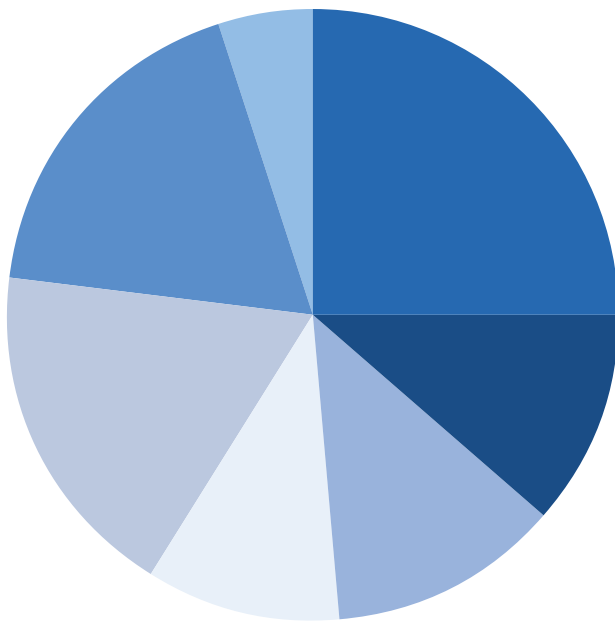
